Outdoor warning sirens remain an effective way to alert a large number of people in the shortest possible time. Albany utilizes a Whelen Siren System. There are 14 sirens located throughout the City of Albany with each reaching a distance of nearly one mile in all directions. The system is designed to provide an alert when there is imminent danger of a severe thunderstorm or tornado. There are also voice instructions; however, it is not always possible to hear the instructions clearly.

If the sirens are activated seek shelter **now!**
